

Indicator: Unemployment

Description: Percentage of the labor force without a job in a given year.

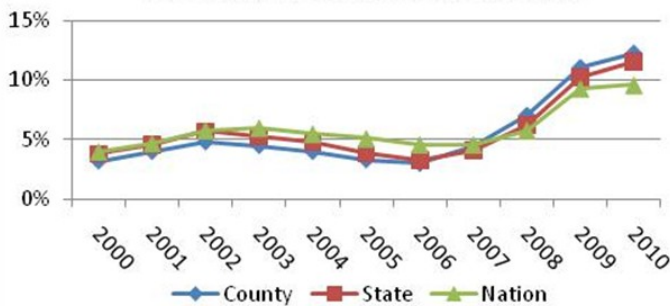

Caveats: This rate does not reflect the people who are not actively looking for work. The unemployment percentage is calculated by dividing the total number of individuals who are unemployed by the total labor force. The labor force includes all civilians ages 16 and older. Unemployed individuals are defined as members of the labor force who report they have no employment during a reference week and they have made some effort to find employment during the four-week period ending with the reference week. Monthly surveys determine the number of people who are unemployed each month in the U.S., Florida and its counties. The annual averages from the surveys are reported here.

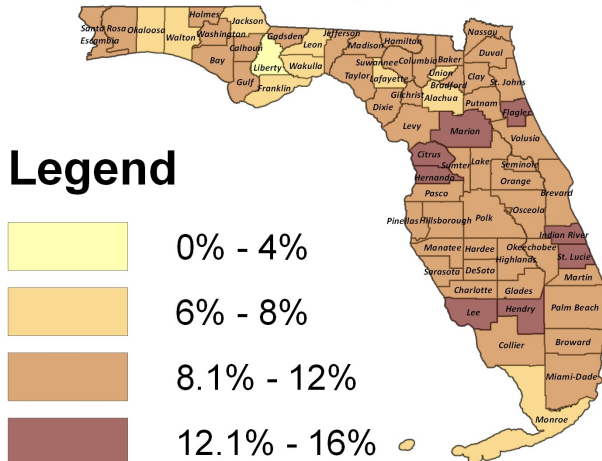

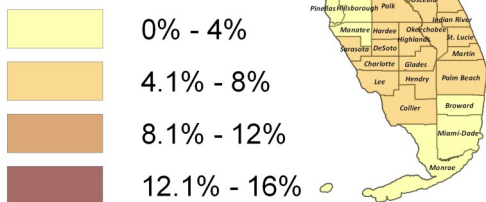

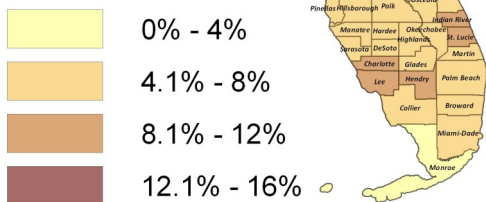
Percent of Unemployed Individuals By County (2007)

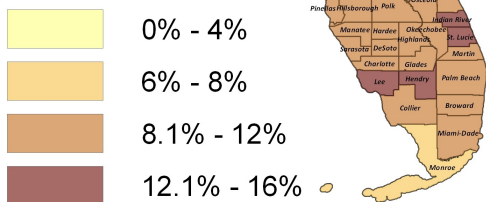
Percent of Unemployed Individuals By County (2008)
