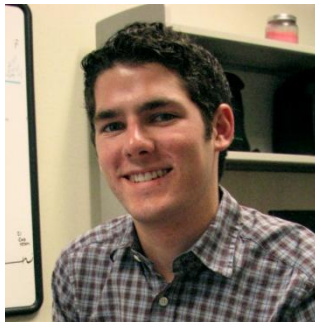
Be on the look-out
